Event is run under FEI Rules – Para Dressage. All Horses must have a FEI Passport for CPEDI3* and a National passport for CPEDI2*

VIRTUS DRESSAGE

Riders must be Virtus classified as per Sport Inclusion Australia and must hold a base EA membership, but horses do not need registration. **Please note this may change in the event that EA and Sport Inclusion Australia sign an MOU prior to the event.**

Freestyles:

- All participants must have reached a minimum score of fifty-eight percent (58%) as an average of the Para FEI A and Para FEI B tests. Athletes may only compete with one (1) Horse in the Freestyle Competition and for those with more than one (1) Horse qualified; they may choose one of the qualified Horses on which to compete and must declare the Horse at the latest one hour after the end of the previous Competition. Should a qualified combination withdraw or be disqualified etc. the next qualified combination may compete.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The Sydney CPEDI 2025 will be conducted in strict accordance with the current edition (including amendments) of:

- FEI Rules & EA Para Dressage Rules & Official Procedures for Dressage Competition as at the 1/1/25 (and subsequent amendments), EA General Regulations (update 1/7/22) The [EA Dressage Rules and Tests](#) and [FEI Dressage Tests](#) may be downloaded from the EA & FEI websites.

MEMBERSHIP & HORSE REGISTRATION

- Horses must have a current dressage EA dressage competition license; horses, owners and riders must be registered and financial with EA or, if from overseas, with their National Federation.
- Horses and rider must compete under their full registered name. Please enter with the name you have on your membership: eg: Deborah not Deb this is a major problem with the entry check and qualification checks. The Organising Committee reserves the right to abbreviate a horses' name for printing purposes. All horses are required to be micro-chipped as per national rules.
- CPEDI'S: Athletes living outside of their country of nationality can participate with permission from their Federation and FEI (Art.119:6.1 FEI Gen Regs)
- All horses entered for the CPEDI whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official FEI Passport, or FEI recognition Card OR require National Passport approved by the FEI, as a means of identification and to establish ownership. (FEI Gen. Regs. Art. 137). EA National Passport documents are available from the EA National office. Riders must ensure that they have appropriate documents on arrival. WITHDRAWALS (SCRATCHING) AND REFUNDS POLICY

Scratching and Refunds: Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 24 hours of the completion of the event. In such cases, 50% of the entry fees will be retained by the O.C. Scratchings made after Friday 13th June, there will be no refunds given for entry fees. Stabling etc will be refunded only. Entry fees will be refunded in full for withdrawals before the closing date, and, for riders on the reserve list who are not offered a start in a competition. The administration fee will not be refunded.

Withdrawals

(Rule 10.4): No competitor shall withdraw from a competition within 8 hours before the start of the competition without the permission of the Organising Committee. A written statement giving reasons for the withdrawal must be handed to the Event Office prior to the commencement of the competition, horses may be subjected to a veterinary inspection. Penalty for non-compliance – max. of \$A200.

OBJECTIONS & APPEALS

Protests and Appeals: Objections must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$100.00. Attention is drawn to Rule 1.6 of EA Dressage Rules (refers to EA General Regulations 163, 164, 165).

SADDLERY & EQUIPMENT

Horse Identification/bridle numbers (two) must be always worn when the horse is outside its stable. The Organising Committee will issue BRIDLE NUMBERS TO ALL horses entered in the CPEDI2*/3* and Virtus for the duration of the event.

FREESTYLES

Only the movements up to and included in the current tests at the level being ridden may be shown.

- The format and procedure for supplying music will be notified after the close of entries.
- Equality of scores: if two competitors receive the same final score, the one with the highest marks for artistic presentation is the winner.
- Freestyle Music: Music check times will be allocated on website. All music is to be submitted to this link.

PRESENTATIONS

A presentation schedule will be available on the event website and Facebook.

STABLING, CAMPING

When you book stables, please remember that stables are charged **per day** - One overnight stay in stables means two stable days to be paid.

Camping and cabins are paid by night.

Please note the correct arrival **Thursday 12th not before 4pm** and departure day on the entry.

Changes to entry for any of the above items after the close of entries will include a late entry fee.

Bedding: All stables now have rubber floor, and the number of shavings depends on length of stay and preference. 4-6 bales should be sufficient for a 4 day stay.

CAMPING & CATERING and ACCOMMODATION FOR RIDERS

Camping facilities: These are available on the grounds. All sites are powered. There are good shower and toilet facilities with hot and cold water for males and females in both north and south camping areas. Sites nearest the stables will be allocated firstly to competitors staying for the longer periods. All camping vehicles must have an approved lead connecting to power outlets. Please note SIEC charges for every power lead connected to power so if you have more than one lead connected to a power outlet you will need to pay for 2 camp sites and camp in the North Camping area due to lack of power outlets in the South Camp Area. Please indicate the number of outlets you require on the camping booking. Large semi-trailers will be in the North Camp area in most cases.

Cabin Accommodation on grounds: Small cabins are available for hire. Rooms contain 2 bunk beds with mattresses, a small hanging cupboard, 2 chairs, wall heater, power point and lights - linen is not provided. Rooms must be left clean and tidy and no cooking in rooms. Cabins are popular so we suggest you book with your entry, or you could miss out. Preference for cabins is given to long distance travelers, competitors staying for longer periods, competitors with more than one horse and for stallions.

A “**Riders Retreat**” with cooking, BBQ, TV, Video facilities is available for competitors to use during event.

The riding of electric powered scooters is illegal on public roads in NSW and not permitted at SIEC. If riding a bicycle or non-powered scooter at SIEC helmets are mandatory.



HEALTH & SAFETY ALERT

ELECTRIC SCOOTER USE AT NSW EQUESTRIAN EVENTS

WHAT HAPPENED

At a recent event, a person riding an electric scooter during an event at SIEC lost control and was ejected from the scooter. They sustained serious abdominal injuries and underwent emergency surgery.

ROOT CAUSE: FOLLOWING INVESTIGATION

Electric scooters are increasingly being used to travel around the grounds at equestrian events with most people being unaware that they are illegal for use except on private property.

SIEC, AELEC, Public Showgrounds, etc are **NOT** Private Property.

NSW Police have issued the flyer on the right to clarify electric scooter use within NSW.

ACTIONS REQUIRED

- Competitors and their support teams must not bring electric scooters, hoverboards or electric skateboards to equestrian events held on public property.
- Mobility scooters designed for the mobility impaired are allowed.
- Bicycles, motorised bicycles and unpowered scooters are allowed – a helmet must be worn.
- Where events are held on Private Property check with the event coordinator to determine whether electric scooters are permitted under their event risk management plan prior to bringing them to the event. If allowed wearing a helmet would be recommended.

OTHER/GENERAL INFORMATION

Prize money: Prize money will be credited to competitors/owners within approx. 10- 14 working days after the event via **Electronic Funds Transfer**. Please ensure you enter correct bank details on the entry.

Dogs – Dogs – S.I.E.C. is located within a Regional Park under the control of the National Parks and Wildlife Service, dogs must be on a leash at all times. NO Dangerous dogs please. Owners are responsible for their animals and DNSW will not accept any liability.

Golf Carts: Golf Cart World will no longer take bookings from individuals. If you bring your own golf buggy or similar vehicle, they must be registered, and users must have a current driver license. Golf carts are not permitted in stables (unless authorised by the stable wardens for off-loading of gear). Dangerous and irresponsible use of golf carts will not be tolerated. Please take care when driving through the venue, and horses have right of way.

Transport: There is no public transport to the venue

Exercise and Warm Up Area: Warm-up/ training arenas are available for use prior to competition. More information will be contained in the pre-event information emailed to competitors. All training must have stewards present.

Indemnity: Neither the Organising Group or Equestrian Australia, accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, grooms, owners, ground spectators or any other person or property whatsoever. All competitors, in entering,

undertake to accept this regulation.

Insurances: The OC (EA) has public liability insurance through Equestrian Australia (EA). AUS competitors have some personal accident and public liability insurance as part of their membership of Equestrian Australia. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their horses. They are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

WELFARE OF THE HORSE – FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to always acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia, and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

HORSE VACCINATIONS & BIOSECURITY:

Vaccinations: We recommend that horses are vaccinated for Hendra virus in particular those that reside in high risk Hendra areas we also recommend horse vaccinations for Strangles and Tetanus are up to date.

Biosecurity Horse Health Declaration: A Biosecurity declaration is included on the on-line entry system. Competitors will be required to complete an online Biosecurity Horse Health Declaration for all horses attending the event. More information and a link to the declaration form will be provided after the close of entries to participants accepted to compete at the event.
